



UNESCO Geiranger - Sjøholt – Ålesund (one way)

Geiranger – Eidsdal – Sjøholt – Ålesund

This is a “Travel like the locals” tour. The tours use public transport, i.e. regular buses, ferries and boats, but we have done the planning for you so that you can concentrate on enjoying your trip. You travel on your own - there is no guide or tour leader. On most of our tours you must change several times between different buses/ferries/boats, and it is up to you to make sure you catch your connections – truly travelling like a local! (The tours are set up so that the buses, ferries and boats connect.)

Visit one of the world’s most beautiful fjords - enjoy the mighty Sunnmøre mountains!

The trip goes by bus from Geiranger, up the spectacular Eagle Road, and to Eidsdal where you cross by ferry to Linge. From Linge, you continue via Sjøholt to Ålesund.

The Eagle Road is part of Norwegian Scenic Route Geiranger-Trollstigen. Norwegian Scenic Routes are selected roads that run through landscapes with unique natural qualities, along coasts and fjords, mountains and waterfalls. The routes are intended as alternatives to the main roads, and the drive itself should be an enjoyable experience. Ålesund is the largest town in Møre and Romsdal county. The town is known for its art nouveau buildings and offers a wide selection of shops, restaurants/cafés and activities.

If you have time, you must walk up to the Aksla “town mountain” and Fjellstua. There are stairs up from the town centre, with view points and benches on the way up. From the top you can see the whole town, in addition to the fjord and islands around Ålesund. Another popular place to visit is the aquarium at Atlanterhavsparken.

The tourist information office is beautifully situated at Skateflukaia. The team here can help you make the most out of your stay in Ålesund. Also, from Ålesund you can take a variety of Travel like the locals trips.

* Stops at the Eagle Bend for photos if possible (depending on traffic etc.)

** Ferry departure times vary slightly during the summer, but both the bus to Eidsdal and the bus from Linge connect with the ferry.

*** On Saturdays and Sundays, bus 210 goes all the way from Linge to Ålesund. On weekdays, switch to bus no. 100 at Sjøholt.

Geiranger-Eidsdal: Take bus no. 211 from Geiranger to Eidsdal. The bus starts from Union hotel or the bus shelter across the road from the ferry harbor in Geiranger. The end stop for the bus from Geiranger is Eidsdal ferry quay (Eidsdal ferjekai) and you leave the bus there.

Eidsdal-Linge: At Eidsdal ferry quay walk on board the Eidsdal-Linge ferry and leave the ferry once it has arrived at Linge.

Note! It is important that you go directly from the bus to the connecting ferry from Eidsdal in order to catch the connection at Linge.

Linge-Sjøholt: From Linge you take bus no. 210 towards Ålesund to Sjøholt.

If you travel Monday – Friday, you switch to bus no. 100 towards Ålesund and Volda at Sjøholt. On Saturday and Sundays, bus no. 210 goes all the way to Ålesund town centre.
